BHS Overview

Black History School (BHS) relates powerful stories from the past to our present. By studying the similarities between selected passages from the Book of Daniel with certain aspects of Black History, we will discover the transformative influence we can have in the world today.

Lesson Aim:

To inspire participants to embrace bravery through prayer in the face of challenges and stand firm in their faith.

Objective: To inspire participants to embrace bravery through prayer in the face of challenges and stand firm in their faith, drawing insights from the biblical narrative in Daniel 6:3-23 and connecting it to the *Children's Crusade* during the *Civil Rights Movement*.

Introduction:

- 1. Begin with a brief discussion on the concept of bravery. Ask students to share what "being brave" means to them and if they have examples of bravery from their own lives or history.
- 2. Introduce the lesson aim: To learn valuable lessons about standing firm in beliefs and overcoming adversity with trust in God.
- 3. Provide an overview of Daniel 6:3-23, emphasizing Daniel's bravery in continuing to pray despite facing the threat of being thrown into a den of lions.

Biblical Reading and Discussion:

- 1. Read Daniel 6:3-23 aloud or have students read it individually.
- 2. Facilitate a discussion on the bravery displayed by Daniel in the face of persecution and the unwavering trust he had in God, as well as how God protected Daniel.
- 3. Discuss the lessons students can learn from Daniel's story about prayer and standing firm in their beliefs and trusting God in challenging situations. Highlight God's promise concerning prayer in Matthew 6:6.

Black History Parallel - 1963 Civil Rights Children's Crusade:

- 1. Introduce the *Children's Crusade* during the *Civil Rights Movement*, highlighting the bravery of young activists in Birmingham, Alabama, who challenged segregation laws.
- 2. Discuss the parallel themes of bravery between Daniel's story and the *Children's Crusade*, emphasizing the faith and determination of young crusaders to stand up for what they believed was right in the eyes of God.
- 3. Point out that Civil Rights protests were always preceded by prayer.
- 4. Refer to the picture related to the *Children's Crusade* and briefly discuss its historical significance. (Image source: https://www.history.com/news/childrens-crusade-birmingham-civil-rights)

- 3. Discuss the importance of bravery in making positive changes in the world.


